



Markup Round Tripping


Long standing feedback

- Revu was released back in 2005 and the immediate feedback was “This is great, but how can we see these markups in AutoCAD?”
- We built a feature to export a version of PDFs with *only* the markups such that it could be brought back in as a layer, but this was not a practical solution

Connected Sessions

Markups can exist outside a PDF

- Markups are an interactive layer above the PDF content
- The key is how can we relate the PDFs back to the model?
 - For Revit the answer is ViewPorts!
- Additionally, we are developing SDKs to be able to render markups standalone.
- Revit is the first, but going forward we see this as a template to create the same experience for more CAD applications
